At Lake View – you can explore the house, see HHR's first writing desk, hear readings of her work, talk to members of the Society. You can go on a self-guided HHR walk around Chiltern - brochures will be available for this purpose. See the places mentioned in her parents letters, her memoir, *Myself When Young*, and recognisable in the fictional town of Barambogie in *The Fortunes of Richard Mahony*.

At the stylish Elvery Gallery (another of Chiltern's heritage buildings, originally a Masonic hall) hear the HHR oration at 4pm.

Dr Sylvia Martin, winner of the HHR Society Essay Prize in 2014 and award winning biographer will deliver an oration - Aileen Palmer's *Getting of Wisdom*.
